- **Exhibit entry required by August 3, 2017**
- **Limit two animals per exhibitor, per lot. Any class with less than three exhibitors and five animals will be combined**
- **All goats must be fitted for show and have official scrapie tattoos or ear tags. Registered goats shall have papers present if requested. Only registered bucks may be shown and bucks show out of trailer. All dairy goats must be dehorned. Livestock Health Requirements for Public Exhibition (see summary of state rules.)**

- **All exhibits must be pre-entered. NO day of entries will be permitted. Animals must be in place one hour before start of show on the day of the show and will be released following show. Cotton and Cream Fashion Show

1. The object of this class is two-fold: to enhance the Dairy Animal and to promote the natural fiber-- Cotton; and a fashion parade of imaginatively attired exhibitors and well- behaved Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goats.
2. The contest will be judged on modern fashionable dress selected, which must be attractive and lend style to the class. The garment worn must be made of a fabric containing a **minimum of 60% cotton.**
3. Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goats must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter and must be shown at the 2017 Morrison County Fair.
4. Matching accessories for the animal are highly encouraged.
5. Contestants do not need to make their outfits.
6. Animal does NOT need to be owned by fashion contest exhibitor.
