- **Premiums: 1st Place - \$10.00; 2nd Place - \$8.00; 3rd Place - \$6.00; 4th Place - \$4.00**
- **Limit two animals per exhibitor, per lot. Any class with less than three exhibitors and five animals will be combined.**
- **Livestock health requirements for public exhibition (see summary of state rules.) Sheep need official ear tag with a unique serial number to meet guidelines of the National Scrapie Eradication Program. For details call MN Board of Animal Health at 1-866-873-2824, ext. 30**
- **ALL exhibits must be pre-entered. NO day of entries will be permitted. Animals must be in place one hour before start of show on the day of the show and will be released following show. Pen space is on a first come, first served basis. All others will be permitted to show out of their trailers, in designated area**

Lads and Ladies Lead (Class 14 & 15)

1. Entrants must wear a casual or formal garment/outfit (not a costume), made of no less than 70% wool. Entries shall include a description of the garment to be worn, the background of the contestant, and the breed of sheep (maximum 150 words). This description will be read aloud as written, as the contestant and his/her animal promenade the ring.
2. The entrant will be judged as follows: one third on the garment; on-third on the handling/appearance of the sheep; one-third on overall image. In the case of tie, creativity and originality will be given emphasis.

- Class 15 Senior Lamb (9-18-years old)

Market Lamb Jackpot

- Jackpot Show: \$10 per head entry fee.

- 100% Payback.
- All breeds compete together.
- Limit two animals per exhibitor, per lot. Any class with less than three exhibitors and five animals will be combined.
- All entries in classes 9, 10, 11 must be slick shorn.

Lamb Lead Wool Fashion Show

1. The object of this class is two-fold: a fashion parade of exhibitors and well-behaved halter led sheep.
2. The contestant will be judged on modern fashionable dress selected, which must be attractive and lend style to the class. The garment must be made of wool or at least 70% wool blend, or by-products of sheep. All wool must be natural or natural wool blend. No synthetic wool's (man-made) will be allowed.
3. Sheep must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter. All rules for exhibiting sheep at the Morrison County Fair
4. Matching accessories for the animal are highly encouraged.
5. Contestants do NOT need to make their outfits.
6. Animal does NOT need to be owned by fashion contest exhibitor.
