THIS IS YOUR COUNTY FAIR! You can make it a banner event by entering exhibits in the various departments. Attend in person. Stop at the Secretary's office and give us any suggestions for improving the fair. We wel-come your comments as we wish to make this event one of which we CAN ALL BE PROUD.

The printing of this Premium List is a very necessary part of the Fair but the cost of printing this list is quite substantial and the Fair Board wishes to thank the businesses and professional people of this county for their whole-hearted support.

GENERAL RULES

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

1 Beef, Swine, Sheep & Meat Goats register on Showman.app Entries are due June 23, 2025. No late entries will be accepted. Must pay online.

NON-LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

- 3 Non-livestock entries received must be postmarked by June 15, 2025.
- 4 Entries in all divisions will be limited to space available. The management reserves the right to close entries at any time when present accommodations are exhausted.
- 5 All livestock from out-of-state must have health papers present for vet checks. Registered animals need registration papers present for proper ID.
- 6 NON-LIVESTOCK exhibits are open ONLY to Morrison County residents and residents of school districts which have schools located in Morrison County.
- 7 No article or animal shall compete for more than one premium except livestock competing in teams or groups. This does not apply to sweepstakes or special premium competition for which no entry is required.
- 8 Exhibitors in non-livestock departments shall be allowed a maximum of one (1) exhibit in each lot.
- 9 Livestock and articles must be entered in the name of the bonafide owners.

10 All exhibits including animals shall be claimed on Sunday, June 29, 2025 from 5 pm - 7 pm, exhibits left after 7 pm on Sunday will be left at your own risk and will become property of the fair.

The exhibit building will close at 7 pm on Sunday.

LIVESTOCK SANITATION

11 The rules and regulations for the exhibition of livestock as established by the Minnesota Board of Animal Health will be enforced by the offcial fair veterinarian.

EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY IN MN SUMMARY OF STATE RULE GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The exhibition management may adopt more but not less restrictive health requirements than required by state rule.

Livestock or poultry known by the exhibitor to have an infectious, communicable disease or to have been exposed to an infectious, communicable disease, or to be from a quarantined herd or flock may not be entered in an exhibition. Warts and ringworm are considered communicable diseases. Therefore, livestock affected by these diseases cannot be exhibited. A statement from a veterinarian that an animal is being treated for these diseases is not acceptable.

All livestock will be inspected by the Official Veterinarian on the opening day and during the exhibition. The Official Veterinarian will order the immediate removal to a quarantined facility or removal from the exhibit premises of any livestock with symptoms of infectious or communicable diseases. Animals placed in a quarantine facility must remain there until removed from the exhibition premises. They may not enter a show ring. This includes livestock with warts or ringworm.

All testing must be conducted prior to the exhibition, and a record of the test results on a test chart or intrastate Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must accompany the tested animals. Livestock and poultry entered in a petting exhibit are not exempt from the exhibition rules if the animals are from more then one farm or there are other animals at the exhibit.

CATTLE

Livestock Health Requirements for Public Exhibition - At this time, there are no state requirements for bovine tuberculosis (TB) testing. However, new intrastate movement requirements may be in effect during the 20245exhibition season for certain counties in northwest Minnesota. An updated version of this document will be distributed once specific information on MN Intrastate movement requirements becomes available. Also, check the MN Board of Animal Health Website at bah.state.mn.us for updates. For MN State Fair tuberculosis testing requirements, call (651) 288-4417 or mnstatefair.org.

POULTRY

Poultry, except waterfowl and pigeons, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band and accompanied by a form approved by the board to show compliance with one of the following: (1) negative test for pullorum-typhoid disease conducted within 90-days prior to the opening date of the exhibition; or (2) originate directly from parent stock tested and found negative for pullorum-typhoid disease within the last 12-months. In addition, turkeys must be tested negative or originate directly from parent stock that is tested negative for Salmonella typhimwrium, Mycoplasma gallisepticum and Mycoplasma synoviae.

SWINE

Swine must be individually identified and must: (1) have a negative official pseudo-rabies test conducted within 30-days prior to the opening date of the exhibition; or (2) originate directly from a qualified pseudo-rabies - negative herd; or 3) originate directly from a Stage IV or V county or area. All 50 states are currently pseudo-rabies Stage V (Pseudo-rabies Free Status).

SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and goats, including wethers, must be identified with official identification approved for use in the scrapie eradication program. For exception to test requirements refer to "Slaughter Classes."

HORSES

All horses must be negative to an official test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) within 12-months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A test is not required for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam.

CATTLE, GOATS, SHEEP, SWINE & POULTRY (NOT ORIGINATING IN MINNESOTA)

Animals must meet the Minnesota Importation requirements in addition to the requirements outlined in this summary. The Certificate of Veterinarian Inspection must list the name of the exhibition as consignee. Certification will be accepted if examination and tests are conducted within 90-days prior to the exhibition, except swine pseudo-rabies tests, which must be made within 30-days. The Gp 1 ELISA test is approved for importation of swine.

- 12 Livestock exhibitors are expected to contact their vets for advice concerning the specific tests required for their animals, to arrange to have the testing done, and procure the proper test charts for the official Fair Vet. All test charts will be completed before entry.
- 13 All livestock exhibitors must pay their own veterinarian testing fees.

LIVESTOCK HOUSING

- 14 Water for livestock will be furnished. Each exhibitor will have to furnish hay and bedding.
- 15 Each livestock exhibitor will be required to keep his/her entries clean and orderly and place refuse and manure in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Fair.

JUDGING

- 4-H Judging will be directed through the office of the University of MN Extension.
- 17 All other judging will begin as announced in the daily schedules.
- 18 Registered livestock may not compete against grade livestock except in classes which specifically state the fact.
- 19 Exhibitors shall be prepared to show ownership or proof of registration at time of entry and judging.

PREMIUMS

- 20 Premiums will be awarded according to the schedule as published.
- 21 Premiums will not be awarded on livestock or articles of inferior merit, regardless of the number in competition for a premium.
- 22 Where there is only one exhibitor in one lot, the premium given will be as the merit of the animals or article may warrant.

- 23 Premium checks that are not available at the end of the fair will be mailed to the address on the entry form
- 24 Premium checks not cashed within 30-days of issue will be considered forfeited to the Agricultural Society.

OTHER

- 25 The Fair assumes no responsibility for injury or damage caused by livestock or other exhibits.
- 26 Any exhibitor failing to cooperate with the stated and published rules and regulations of the Fair will forfeit any premiums due from the Fair.
- 27 Any person or group that conducts a protest action must limit its activity to the location designated by the Fair Board. The designated location is east of the Northeast gate along 158 Street on fairground property. No entrances or exits can be obstructed or limited in any way.

Food Preservation/Canning/Dried Foods All recipes, procedures, and times followed must be according to current USDA and University of Minnesota Extension Service publications. Jars used must be heattempered glass canning jars. All jars must be sealed with two-piece canning lids. All canned goods are to be exhibited in quart or pint jars. Products entered in recycled jars, such as mayonnaise, peanut butter, etc., will not be accepted! Leave screw bands on the two-piece jar lids. Each exhibit must have a canning label attached. The canning label must state the canned product's name, the date product was canned, its processing method and processing time. One year is limit for canned goods.

Jams and Jellies must be processed in a boiling water bath according to USDA and University of Minnesota Extension Service food preservation publications. No artificial food coloring should be added to entries. No jams or jellies or spreads needing refrigeration or freezer storage will be accepted. Jams and jellies must be in jelly or ½ pint jars and must be sealed with two-piece lids. No wax covered products will be accepted!
