Trophies from other states can be brought in as well. Shawn also scores for Boone and Crockett and Pope and Young Systems.

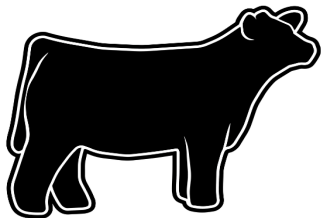

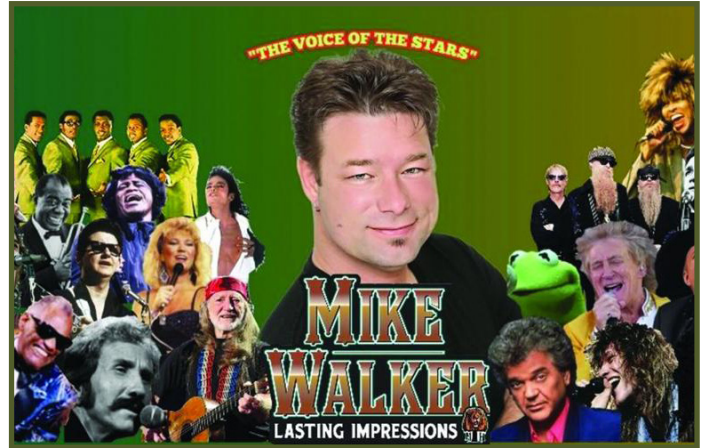

We are pleased to present the 2026 Premium List. This year's Fair will continue the tradition of excellence established in years past. As your County Fair, we encourage you to help make it a standout event by entering exhibits across a variety of departments. Be sure to attend in person and experience everything the fair has to offer. We value your input. Please feel free to share your thoughts by visiting the fair office or reaching out to a board member. Your feedback helps us create an event our entire community can take pride in. The Premium List plays an essential role in the success of the Fair, and we sincerely thank the businesses and professionals throughout the county for their generous support.

GENERAL RULES

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

1. **Beef, Swine, Sheep & Meat Goats register on Showman.app**

Entries are due June 22, 2026. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. MUST PAY ONLINE.**

NON-LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

2. Register online at MorrisonCountyFair-MN.fairentry.com and follow prompts or use the form in this Premium Listing Booklet.

Pre-entered entries will be accepted for judging on Wednesday, June 24, 2026, from 7 am - 4 pm.

3. Non-livestock entry forms must be postmarked by June 15, 2026.

4. Entries in all divisions will be limited to space available. The management reserves the right to close entries at any time when present accommodations are exhausted.

5. All livestock from out-of-state must have health papers present for vet checks. Registered animals need registration papers present for proper ID.

6. NON-LIVESTOCK exhibits are open ONLY to Morrison County residents and residents of school districts which have schools located in Morrison County.

7. No article or animal shall compete for more than one premium except livestock competing in teams or groups. This does not apply to sweepstakes or special premium competition for which no entry is required.

8. Exhibitors in non-livestock departments shall be allowed a maximum of one (1) exhibit in each lot.

9. Livestock and articles must be entered in the name of the bona fide owners.

10. All exhibits, including animals, shall be claimed on Sunday, June 28, 2026 from 5pm - 7pm. Exhibits left after 7pm on Sunday will be left at your own risk and will become property of the fair. The exhibit building will close at 7pm on Sunday.

LIVESTOCK SANITATION

11. The rules and regulations for the exhibition of livestock as established by the Minnesota Board of Animal Health will be enforced by the official fair veterinarian.

EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY IN MN SUMMARY OF STATE RULE GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The exhibition management may adopt more but not less restrictive health requirements than required by state rule. Livestock or poultry known by the exhibitor to have an infectious, communicable disease or to have been exposed to an infectious, communicable disease, or to be from a quarantined herd or flock may not be entered in an exhibition. Warts and ringworm are considered communicable diseases. Therefore, livestock affected by these diseases cannot be exhibited. A statement from a veterinarian that an animal is being treated for these diseases is not acceptable.

All livestock will be inspected by the Official Veterinarian on the opening day and during the exhibition. The Official Veterinarian will order the immediate removal to a quarantined facility or removal from the exhibit premises of any livestock with symptoms of infectious or communicable diseases. Animals placed in a quarantine facility must remain there until removed from the exhibition premises. They may not enter a show ring. This includes livestock with warts or ringworm. All testing must be conducted prior to the exhibition, and a record of the test results on a test chart or intrastate Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must accompany the tested animals. Livestock and poultry entered in a petting exhibit are not exempt from the exhibition rules if the animals are from more than one farm or there are other animals at the exhibit.

CATTLE

Cattle must be officially identified prior to exhibition. Tags applied on or after November 5, 2024, must be visually AND electronically readable. Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) using the Animal Identification Number (AIN) System meets this requirement. Official ID may not be removed from an animal once it is applied. Approved official identification for cattle if applied on or after November 5, 2024. Animal Identification Number (AIN) System. • Consists of 15 digits, beginning with "840" for the U.S. • Visual and Radio Frequency Identification (RFID). Approved official identification for cattle if applied prior to November 5, 2024. National Uniform Ear Tagging System (NUES) begins with the official state number "41" for Minnesota. Breed Registry Tattoos and Tags • Acceptable if accompanied by documentation listing the breed registration number. Pending registrations are not acceptable. • Breed registry tattoos valid within Minnesota and for animals imported from Iowa, Missouri, and South Dakota.

POULTRY

Chickens, turkeys, and game birds at exhibitions, except baby poultry, must be individually identified with a numbered leg or wing band. The band may also include letters, such as names/initials. • Hatching eggs and young poultry that are too small to band can be exhibited as a group if the Hatchery Permit Number or National Poultry Improvement Plan (PIP) Number is written on the cage, box or enclosure. • Leg bands are available to the fair manager upon request by contacting the Minnesota Poultry Testing Laboratory at 320-231-5170. All chickens, turkeys, game birds, and hatching eggs from these birds must originate from a hatchery or breeding flock that is classified U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under NPIP or be negative to a pullorumtyphoid test within 90 days prior to the opening of the exhibition. • All chickens, turkeys, game birds, and hatching eggs from these birds must be accompanied by a certificate or test chart approved by the Board that demonstrates compliance with the requirements above. See the Poultry exhibition web page (<https://www.bah.state.mn.us/exhibitions/#poultry>) for a list of approved certificates and test charts. • If a test chart is used to demonstrate compliance, the band number on the bird must match what is listed on the test chart. Ratites, waterfowl, pigeons, and hatching eggs from these birds must meet the general requirements for exhibition and importation. For questions related to poultry exhibition requirements, please contact the Minnesota Poultry Testing Laboratory at 320-231-5170.

SWINE

Breeding and feeding swine must be officially identified prior to exhibition. Swine in slaughter-only classes do not require official ID. Piglets born at an exhibition must be officially identified before leaving the premises. The following are approved official identification for swine. Official ID may not be removed from an animal once it is applied. 1. National Uniform Ear Tagging System (NUES) Begins with the official state number; "41" or "MN" for Minnesota. 2. Animal Identification Number (AIN) System • Consists of 15 digits, beginning with "840" for the U.S. • Visual or Radio Frequency Identification (RFID). 3. Ear notching with Breed Registration • Must be accompanied by registration paperwork. • Pending registration is not acceptable. 4. Slap or Ear Tattoos - For feeding class swine only. Tattoos or tags with monitored herd or premises number are acceptable.

SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and goats at public exhibitions must be officially identified. The following are approved official identification for sheep and goats. Official ID may not be removed from an animal once it is applied. 1. Flock identification (ID) Tags • Includes the flock ID number beginning with the state abbreviation (maximum nine characters, including state abbreviation) along with a unique herd management number (maximum six characters). • Plastic or metal. 2. Sheep/Goat Serial Tags • Begins with state abbreviation; eight characters total, last four or five are numerical. • Plastic or metal. 3. Animal Identification Number (AIN) System • Consists of 15 digits, beginning with "840" for the U.S. • Visual or Radio Frequency Identification (RFID). 4. Tattoos for any tattoo to be considered official identification, it must be legible. Registered sheep/goats • Breed registry tattoos that are recorded with a sheep or goat registry association. • Must be accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate. Pending registration will not be accepted. Non-registered sheep/goats • State-approved tattoos assigned by the Board. Call the Board at 651-201-6809 to request a tattoo or find out if a tattoo has already been assigned. • Tattoo must include the state-approved prefix beginning with the state abbreviation and include a unique number. • The animal must be accompanied by a state-issued document stating • The tattoo prefix is recorded with the state and assigned in the National Scrapie Database. • The flock ID number and the complete tattoo number (including the state-assigned prefix and the animal number).

HORSES

All horses, donkeys, mules, zebra, and other equine species must be negative to an official test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) (e.g. Coggins test) conducted within 12 months prior to the opening date of an exhibition. Suckling foals accompanying a negative dam do not require EIA testing.

OTHER SPECIES

Requirements for other species not listed • All domestic, exotic, and wild mammals or birds that come from out-of-state for exhibition must be accompanied by a CVI. This includes, but is not limited to, llamas, alpacas, rabbits, pigeons, and hoof stock. • It is highly recommended to follow biosecurity best practices for rabbits and all animals by working with a veterinarian to identify risk factors. Exhibitions managers are encouraged to establish event and site-specific biosecurity plans.

12. Livestock exhibitors are expected to contact their vets for advice concerning the specific tests required for their animals, to arrange to have the testing done, and procure the proper test charts for the official Fair Vet. All test charts will be completed before entry.

13. All livestock exhibitors must pay their own veterinarian testing fees.

LIVESTOCK HOUSING

14. Water for livestock will be furnished. Each exhibitor will have to furnish hay and bedding.

15. Each livestock exhibitor will be required to keep his/her entries clean and orderly and place refuse and manure in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Fair.

JUDGING

16. 4-H Judging will be directed through the office of the University of MN Extension.

17. All other judging will begin as announced in the daily schedules.

18. Registered livestock may not compete against grade livestock except in classes which specifically state the fact.

19. Exhibitors shall be prepared to show ownership or proof of registration at time of entry and judging.

PREMIUMS

20. Premiums will be awarded according to the schedule as published.

21. Premiums will not be awarded on livestock or articles of inferior merit, regardless of the number in competition for a premium.

22. Where there is only one exhibitor in one lot, the premium given will be as the merit of the animals or article may warrant.

23. Premium checks that are not available at the end of the fair will be mailed to the address on the entry form

24. Premium checks not cashed within 30-days of issue will be considered forfeited to the Agricultural Society.

OTHER

25. The Fair assumes no responsibility for injury or damage caused by livestock or other exhibits.

26. Any exhibitor failing to cooperate with the stated and published rules and regulations of the Fair will forfeit any premiums due from the Fair.

27. Any person or group that conducts a protest action must limit its activity to the location designated by the Fair Board. The designated location is east of the Northeast gate along 158 Street on fairground property. No entrances or exits can be obstructed or limited in any way.

Food Preservation/Canning/Dried Foods All recipes, procedures, and times followed must be according to current USDA and University of Minnesota Extension Service publications. Jars used must be heat-tempered glass canning jars. All jars must be sealed with two-piece canning lids. All canned goods are to be exhibited in quart or pint jars. Products entered in recycled jars, such as mayonnaise, peanut butter, etc., will not be accepted! Leave screw bands on the two-piece jar lids. Each exhibit must have a canning label attached. The canning label must state the canned product's name, the date product was canned, processing method and processing time. One year is limit for canned goods.

Jams and Jellies must be processed in a boiling water bath according to USDA and University of Minnesota Extension Service food preservation publications. No artificial food coloring should be added to entries. No jams or jellies or spreads needing refrigeration or freezer storage will be accepted. Jams and jellies must be in jelly or 1/2 pint jars and must be sealed with two-piece lids. No wax covered products will be accepted!

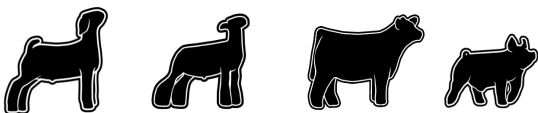

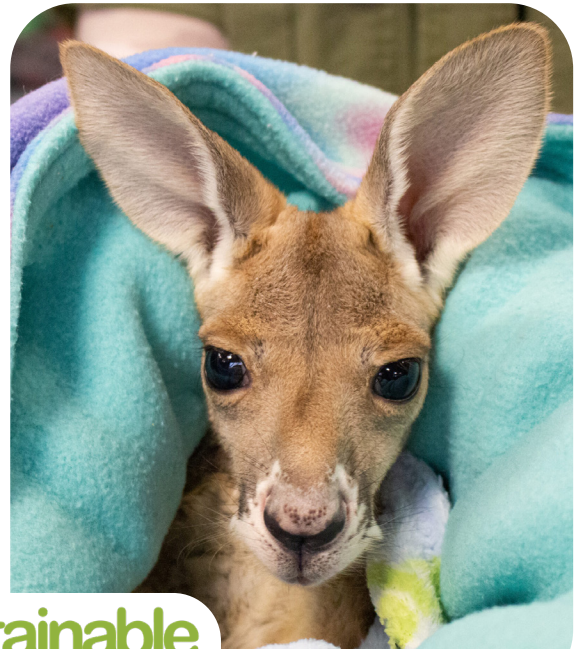
